Go to Edit - Stroke.



Set the <u>Width</u> to 1 pixel. Set the <u>Location</u> to Inside. Click on the Colour picker box.



Select a colour for your border. Typically a mid-grey colour works well on mono and most colour images. Selecting a colour from within the image can work well too. Click <u>OK</u> to apply the border.
